## COURSE DETAILS

The course consists of:

### **Exam Paper 1: 19th Century Fiction (40% of your overall mark)**

Section A: Reading

Section B: Imaginative writing

### **Exam Paper 2: 20th and 21st Century Non-Fiction (60% of your overall mark)**

Section A: Reading

Section B: Transactional writing

In addition you are required to complete a **Speaking and Listening assessment** which includes:

Communicating and adapting language

Interacting and responding and creating and sustaining a role

## ENTRY GUIDELINES

Applicants must pass an initial assessment.

## ASSESSMENT METHOD

Written exam paper, based on set texts, and speaking and listening assessment.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

An ability to meet deadlines and organise own study and to work with a degree of independence.

Communication skills - Ability to communicate effectively on a one to one basis e.g. with tutors, students and in a group as part of a discussion. You should also have the confidence to talk to a larger group on a prepared topic. Individual, pair and group oral activities are a formally assessed part of the course.
